Successes, Opportunities, Challenges

1. Learning Loss Initiative

This year we used the funding from the government targeted for learning loss to support the growth of students in grades 1-5 with their language skills. We focused on small numbers of students in targeted interventions. Students were generally seen daily. We did have 75% of the day focused on literacy development and 24% of the day on mathematics.

2. First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Programming

This year was a special year where CES accepted a headdress that was gifted from the family of the late Kendrick Smith. A ceremony was held on June 7th. Students were welcomed by a Blackfoot Elder and were able to witness Blackfoot dancing.

3. Student Leadership Committee

The Student Leadership Committee (SLC) has been involved in organizing a variety of seasonal and holiday events, demonstrating their dedication to fostering an engaging school community. SLC has been instrumental in planning various spirit days, including Twin Day, Western Day, and Dress Your Best Day, aimed at boosting school spirit and fostering a sense of community among students.

SLC planned and led a Halloween carnival, and haunted house, which provided students with exciting opportunities to celebrate the spirit of Halloween. Additionally, the SLC took on the responsibility of orchestrating the Remembrance Day assembly, demonstrating their commitment to honoring important historical events.

SLC continued their impactful work during the holiday season by organizing festive activities such as a Christmas dance and a door decorating contest, adding to the joyful atmosphere of the school community. Their involvement in spreading holiday cheer extended beyond the school walls, as they utilized funds raised by the Parent Council to purchase almost \$2000 worth of toys. These toys were then personally delivered by SLC students to the Angel Tree drop-off location, demonstrating their commitment to giving back to the community and supporting those in need during the holiday season.

In February, the SLC took the lead in promoting kindness through various initiatives as part of Kindness Month. One notable project was the Kindness Rocks project, where students decorated rocks with kind or inspirational words and exchanged them with peers, fostering a culture of positivity and empathy within the school community.

SLC organized and implemented numerous school-wide games, activities, and initiatives throughout the year, enriching the student experience and promoting a sense of connection and engagement among peers. Through their dedication to service, leadership, and creativity, the SLC continues to make a positive impact on the school community.
